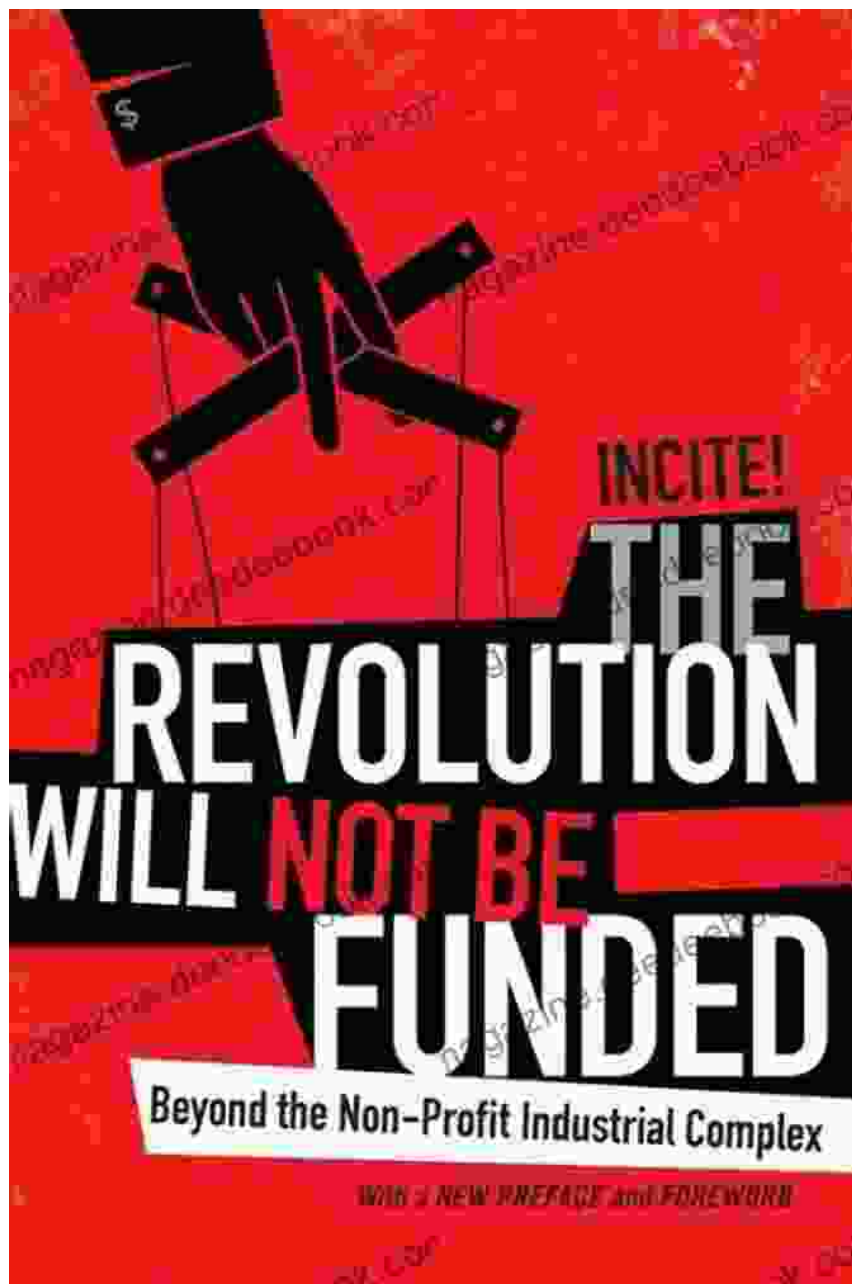
The Fire Next Time by Jesmyn Ward
