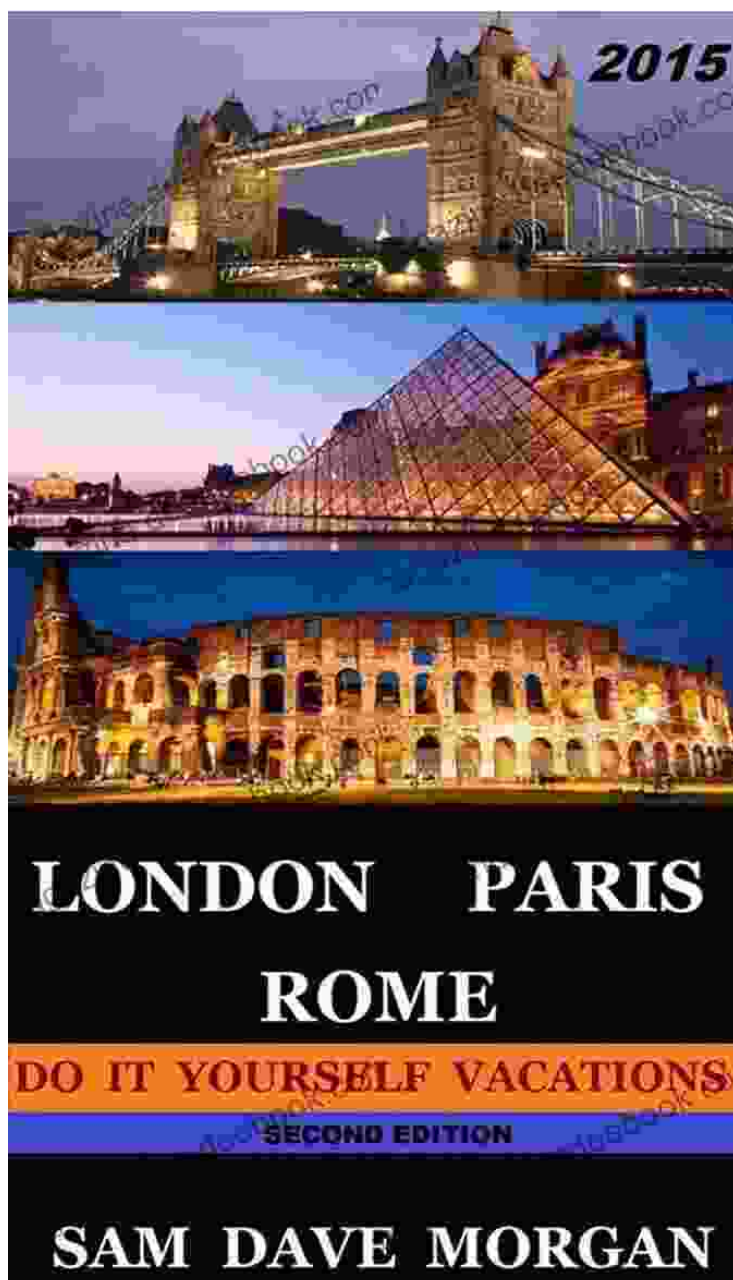


Savoring London's Culinary Delights

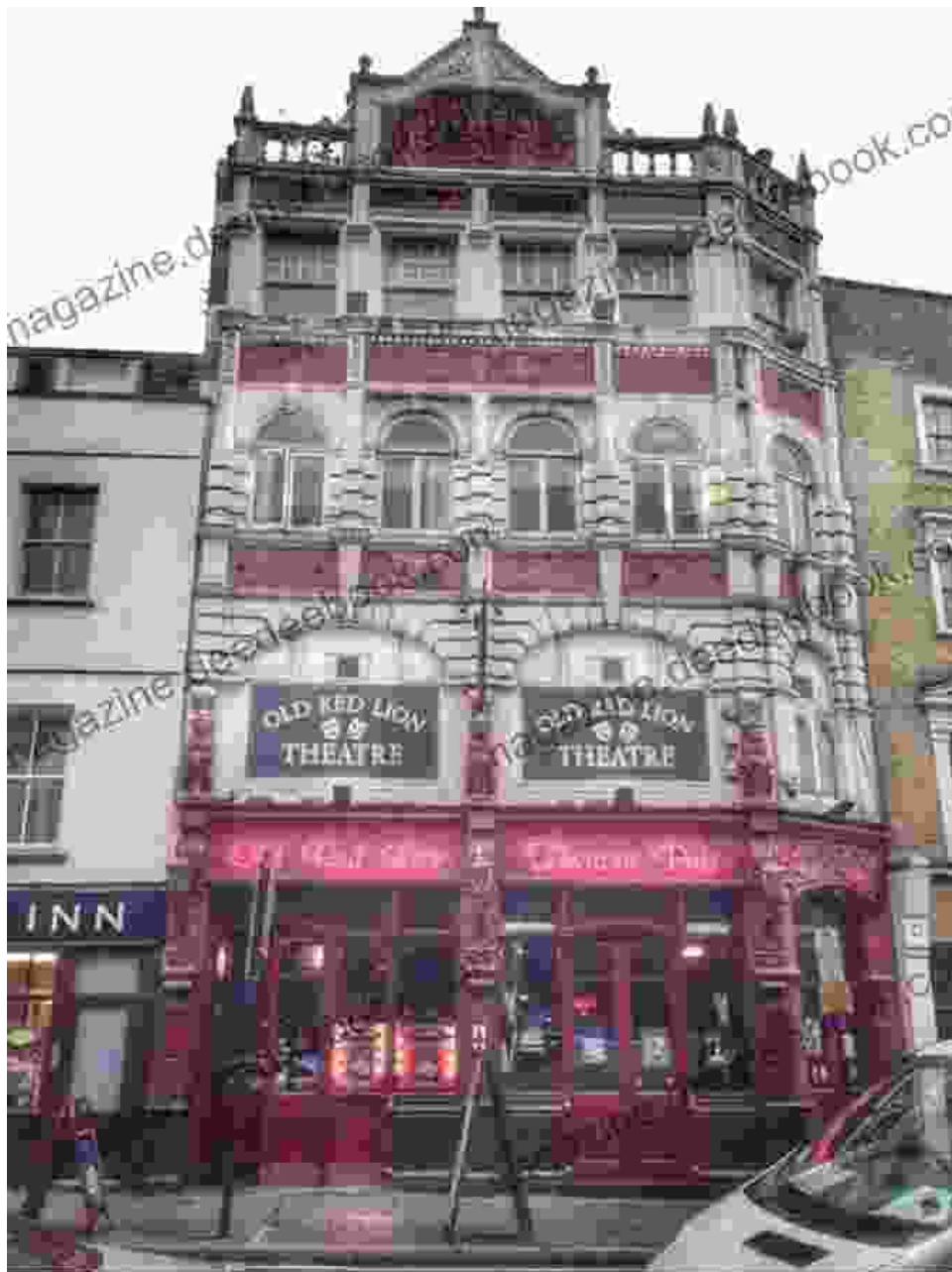
