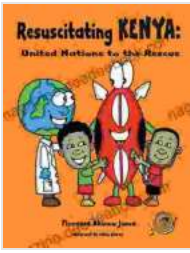

Kenya Drought Severity Map (2017)

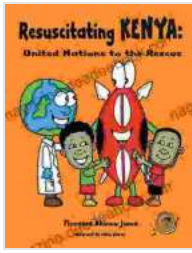

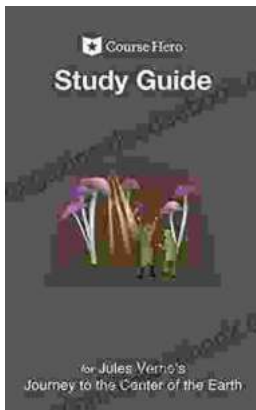

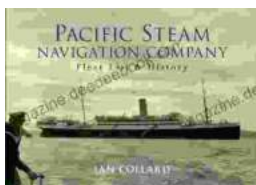
