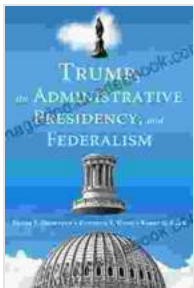


Trump and the Administrative Presidency: A Blow to Federalism

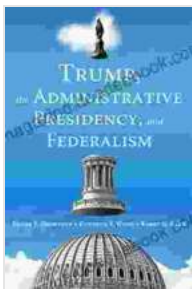
Undermining the Separation of Powers

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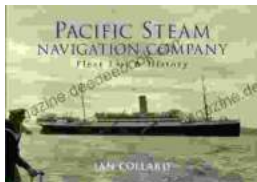
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
