The Ubergate emails

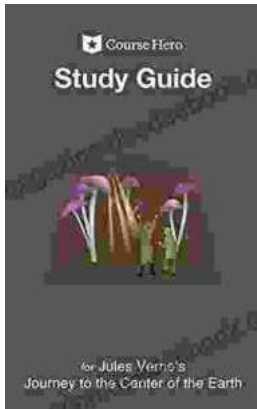

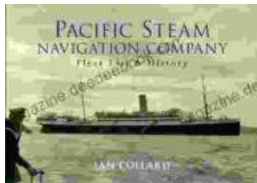
